## AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH; REQUIRING THE SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY, AUDIOLOGY AND HEARING AID DISPENSING PRACTICES BOARD TO ISSUE ETHICS RULES REQUIRING AUDIOLOGISTS AND HEARING AID DISPENSERS TO EDUCATE PURCHASERS ABOUT ASSISTIVE LISTENING TECHNOLOGY AND DESIGN OPTIONS THAT ARE IN ACCORDANCE WITH LATEST STANDARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 61-14B-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996, Chapter 57, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read:

"61-14B-11. BOARD POWERS AND DUTIES.--The board shall:

- adopt rules and regulations and establish policy necessary to carry out the provisions of the Speech-Language Pathology, Audiology and Hearing Aid Dispensing Practices Act in accordance with the Uniform Licensing Act;
- adopt rules implementing continuing education .211590.2

# requirements;

- requiring audiologists and hearing aid dispensers, at the time of the initial examination for possible sale and fitting of a hearing aid if a hearing loss is determined, to inform each prospective purchaser about hearing aid options that can provide a direct connection between the hearing aid and assistive listening systems. These rules shall be in accordance with the latest standards for accessible design adopted by the United States department of justice in accordance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended;
- D. conduct hearings upon charges relating to the discipline of licensees, including the denial, suspension or revocation of a license in accordance with the Uniform Licensing Act;
- E. investigate complaints against licensees by issuing investigative subpoenas prior to the issuance of a notice of contemplated action;
  - F. establish fees for licensure;
- G. provide for the licensing and renewal of licenses of applicants; and
- H. adopt rules that provide for licensure by reciprocity, including temporary permits for speech-language pathologists, audiologists or hearing aid dispensers."
